



VIJNANA VIHARA RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL

was started in 1980 by the people who are experienced and interested in the field of education. The school is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The school is 27 kms away from the centre of Visakhapatnam city. It is located in a village called Gudilova (meaning Temple Valley) on six-lane National highway-16 (Kolkata-Chennai) between Srikakulam and Anakapalli, by-passing Visakhapatnam. It is a quiet and ideal place breathing peace and tranquility with hills on the south and west and plain area on the north and east. It is an ideal spot for learning. The temples of Narayaneswara and Ranganadh Swamy situated in the valley 2 kms away from the school, are attractive tourist spots. The whole atmosphere is surcharged with piety, peace and tranquility. All the students, teachers and staff with their families, reside on the campus breathing the beauty of nature.

HOW TO REACH: To reach the school one has to get into the service road at Anandapuram Jn. from the six lane Highway and take left at the second under pass from the Junction. Those who are coming from Pendurthy, should take right turn at the fifth underpass. All buses from Visakhapatnam and Anakapalle, bound for Srikakulam and Vizianagaram, pass by Anandapuram Junction which is also an express bus stop. City bus no. 222 (from Visakhapatnam R.T.C. Complex to Tagarapu valasa) also passes by this junction. From here, the school is 6 km. towards Anakapalle. One can take city bus number 55T (Tagarapuvalasa - Scindia) which passes by the school. Auto Rickshaws are also available from Anandapuram junction. City Bus No. 888 (from Anakapalle to Tagarapu valasa) Passes by Pendurthy, Gudilova, Anandapuram Junction.

COURSES OF STUDY

The school offers instruction from standard V to XII. The students of standard 'X' and XII' are prepared for the public examinations known as ALL INDIA SECONDARY and SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL EXAMINATION, conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The first batch of standard 'X' students appeared in March 1985 (for A.I.S.S.E. results, see Appendix III).

The medium of instruction is English. Sanskrit is one of the compulsory subjects upto standard VIII. Telugu/Hindi are subjects taught at secondary level. In classes IX and X, the students can choose any ONE out of Telugu, Hindi and Sanskrit for which instruction is arranged at school. Other compulsory subjects are Mathematics, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, History, Civics and Geography. Students of Standards IX and X have practical classes in Science and Mathematics in addition to their regular theory classes, while students of other Standards have demonstrations.

FOR SENIOR SECONDARY CLASSES:

For class XI the courses offered under science stream are M.P.C., Bi.P.C., M.Bi.P.C. which are **residential** courses. In Arts and Commerce stream the courses are M.E.C. and H.E.C however these courses are **Non-residential** for the students around.

The course scheme is as per the norms of C.B.S.E. Qualified and experienced teachers handle all the classes. The school has well equipped laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics to carry practical work. Arrangement for e-learning is available in multimedia class-rooms. There is enough scope for co-curricular and extracurricular activities which are organized through two Clubs and four Houses. The activities include debates, discussions, lectures by eminent personalities, seminars, quiz competitions and project works.

COMPUTER COACHING

Computer Class



The school is well equipped with computers, LAN and Digital Library. Experienced faculty handle the classes in computers. Computer education is included as one of the compulsory subjects in the school curriculum. Besides class room teaching of the subject, the students are also provided with hands-on training on computers.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AIDED CLASSES

The school has information technology aided instruction for all the students which includes multimedia presentations, images, visuals, animations, simulation, audio etc. that enables the students with a better understanding of the concept.



SPECIAL COACHING FOR CLASSES

XI and XII

Special coaching for classes XI and XII will be provided for NEET and IIT JEE entrance examination by subject experts, on payment of additional fee.

ATAL TINKERING LABORATORY

A laboratory for experimenting in electronics and robotics by young minds has been running



with the support of NITI Ayog. Students give shape to their imagination and novel ideas in this laboratory.

I.I.T. FOUNDATION COURSE

1. A foundation course for I.I.T. is given to selected students of standards VIII to XII. The classes are handled by senior lecturers and professors. These classes are conducted on Sundays and the course is optional on payment of additional fees.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT COURSES

With a motto of skilling while schooling, the school offers courses like web designing, plumbing, electrical, pottery, Yogic science, etc. All students from classes VI to XII are to opt for one of these as their choice. The programme runs under the aegis 'Daksha Bharati' aims at enabling the child to gain proficiency in one of the skills.

LIBRARY

School Library

A good library-cum-reading room is provided with over 14,000 books in English, Sanskrit, Telugu and Hindi besides various text books in Science & Humanities. Thirty five periodicals are available in the Reading Room.





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

1. Every student is encouraged to participate in all types of physical education activities. Good play ground and sports & games equipment are provided for the following games. Volleyball, Ball-badminton, Shuttle-

badminton, Tenni-coit, Cricket, Table Tennis, Foot Ball, Base Ball, Hand Ball, Basket Ball, Kho-Kho, Shot-put, Disc throw etc.

2. Gymnastics, Yogasanas and Martial Arts are also taught on regular basis.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. Music

Sangeetam is a compulsory subject for junior classes, as a part of Adharbooth Vishay (Panchamukhi Yojana). However, interested students can have an additional coaching in vocal and instrumental music (Violin, Veena and Mridangam) from our music school Bharathi Kala Vihara, on payment of prescribed fee.

3. Science Forum

Susrutha Vijnana Sastra Mandali, a Science forum organizes various competitions, activities and interactive sessions.

4. Arts Forum

Tilak Sanghika Sastra Mandali, an arts club is instrumental in organizing various competitions in literary and various arts activities. The students are encouraged to participate in these programmes which provide a competitive environment for their innate talents' identifying and strengthening.



EXAMINATIONS

1. Four Unit Tests, Two Term tests are conducted as per the norms of Central Board of Secondary Education. The relevant marks lists of all tests will be sent to the parents periodically.
2. Pre-Board Examination is conducted for classes X and XII on the lines of board examination so as to enable the students face the final examinations with confidence.
3. Examinations for class XII shall be conducted adhering to CBSE norms.
4. Students are encouraged to write other examinations like Talent Tests in Mathematics, Science and General Knowledge, Samskriti Gyana Pariksha, Sanskrit, Hindi etc., conducted by various institutions and organizations throughout the country.

HEALTHCARE

Clinic

1. A Resident Medical Officer is staying on the campus of the school to maintain a 10 bedded hospital by name "Dr. Hedgewar Hospital".
2. Periodical Medical check-up is arranged and students' health records are maintained to assess students' general health.
3. Hot water is supplied for bath during winter.



HOSTEL

Girls Hostel (Kanchi)



Students are accommodated in dormitories. Each student is provided with a cot and a cup-board to preserve his/her personal belongings. Mattress, Pillows and Bed Sheets are to be brought by the student. Other requirements are mentioned separately in Appendix-I. A separate hostel is there for girls. Efficient and dedicated wardens maintain warm and affectionate atmosphere in the hostels.

ADMISSIONS

1. Admission into classes V & VI for boys and girls is subject to selection. Admission for classes VII, VIII and IX is subject to vacancy as well.
2. Minimum age limit for class 'V' is 9 years.
3. Prospectus, application form and other information are available on payment of Rs. 100/- either by cash at school office or on payment of Rs. 200/- through M.O. by post.
4. Application duly filled-in should be get registered by paying Rs. 300/- towards the registration fee by cash at school office or through the mode of payment given in page No.9.
5. Selected candidates will be intimated by phone.
6. Selected candidates of class V are to produce proof of age or T.C. of previous study from recognised school, at the time of admission.
7. Students seeking admission for standards VI to IX must have studied in a recognized English Medium school and are required to produce a T.C. from their former school immediately after the final selection.
8. Merit is a criteria for the students seeking admission into XI after appearing a proficiency test.
9. Candidates seeking admission into 'XI' should either be from state or central boards. Preference shall be given to those who are from English or Hindi medium of study in class 'X'



10. The following are to be produced at the time of provisional admission into 'XI'
 1. Provisional marks memo of class 10th (Original in a span of a month's time)
 2. Migration certificate (for the students other than CBSE board)
 3. TC of previous study.
 4. Study & Conduct certificate
 5. Five passport size photo copies.
 6. A copy of Aadhar card of the student and the parents.
 7. A copy of ration card of the parent.
 8. A copy of the mother's bank pass book 1st page
11. Before the final admissions are made, candidates are obliged to take the medical checkup conducted by the Resident Medical Officer or any other doctor suggested by the management in the clinic attached to the school at Gudilova. Medically fit candidates are admitted.
12. A declaration regarding the discipline and conduct is to be signed by the parent at the time of admission.
13. Admitted candidates for all the classes are to join the school as per the dates informed.

1. In addition to the above, newly admitted students shall pay Rs. 300/- towards the Admission Fee, Accountable Deposit of Rs. 1,000/- and Caution Deposit of Rs. 1,000/-.
2. Total fee to be paid in two installments, amount will be intimated to the parents by the Principal after the announcement of the results.
3. Caution Deposit which is to be paid at the time of admission will be refunded only when the students are withdrawn from the school.
4. Expenditure for casual needs of the student will be met from the Accountable Deposit. At the end of each term, the account of expenditure for the term will be intimated to the parents and they are requested to reimburse the same to maintain the Accountable Deposit of Rs. 1,000/-. The Accountable Deposit will be returned at the time of withdrawal of students after deducting outstanding expenditure, if any.



MODE OF PAYMENT OF FEES

1. Fees payment and other deposits are to be made by demand draft drawn in favour of "Vijnana Vihara Residential School" payable at the BANK OF INDIA, GIDIJALA BRANCH, or MAIN BRANCH of any NATIONALISED BANK of VISAKHAPATNAM.
2. Fees can also be paid through RTGS/UPI to Vijnana Vihara Residential School, A/C. No. 861520110000084, IFSC-code **BKID0008615**, Bank of India, Gidijala Branch, Visakhapatnam District.
3. Payment in **cash or by cheques is not accepted** under any circumstances.

WITHDRAWALS

1. If any parent wants to withdraw the child from the school, the Principal should be informed of the same one month in advance. Withdrawals at the end of the academic year should be informed before the start of new academic session.
2. If the Principal feels that a pupil is not taking the benefit of the School's education, such a student may be asked to leave the school.
3. When a student is withdrawn from the school during middle of the academic year or after completion, all personal belongings are to be taken by him / her within a week.
4. No Fee shall be refunded if the parents withdraws his/her ward during the mid of the academic session and is to clear all dues with the office before issuance of Transfer Certificate (TC)

WORKING DAYS OF THE SCHOOL

Working days and vacation shall be as per the academic calendar. Academic activity is scheduled for two terms with three vacation breaks namely Summer, Dusserah and Sankranti festivals.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARENTS

1. (A) The parents and guardians of students of standards V and VI are allowed to visit their wards twice a month on a Sunday. For the parents and guardians of students of other standards, the visiting day is fixed at one Sunday per month.
(B) Parents can meet Principal/ Vice-Principal and Hostel In-charge at 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Sundays of their visiting schedule.
2. Parents and other visitors are not allowed to enter the dormitories without permission.
3. Students are not allowed to keep money or valuable articles with them. Electronic gadgets like cell-phones, ipods, cameras etc., are not permitted in the hostels.
4. Parents and visitors are requested not to bring eatables to the hostel.
5. If it is absolutely essential, parents/ local guardians may be allowed to take out their children on a scheduled day for which prior written permission was sought from the principal. But the students shall have to be back before 5:00 p.m. Local guardian, if any should be named at the time of admission. During the months of September, December and March, students cannot avail this privilege.
6. When parents are keen on knowing the progress details of their children in person, they are requested to inform the Principal at least one week before their visit to the school.
7. Parents are not allowed to stay during night time along with their wards.



8. Tuition fees, Hostel charges and other maintenance charges are revised as and when the management finds it necessary.
9. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities in maintaining discipline and promoting the ideals for which this institution has stood up all these years.
10. Parents are requested to supply, at the time of admission and subsequently whenever occasion arises, a case study of their wards to take remedial measures, if necessary.
11. The school reserves the right to formulate, delete or alter any rule as and when it feels necessary for the smooth and effective running of the institution.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

1. Students should attend the school and the playground activity in the prescribed uniform only.
2. Absence of students without proper permission may lead to disciplinary action and parents are requested to follow programme schedule in this regard.
3. Students taken home for medical purpose should mandatorily produce the medical prescriptions and a certificate of fitness at the time of rejoining.
4. Students are to report to the school a day before the re-opening at the end of the vacations without fail.
5. Students shall maintain strict discipline in the school and hostel complying with rules and regulations of the school.
6. A minimum of 75% attendance is a must for promotion to next class.

DAILY PROGRAMME

Students are encouraged to keep up and follow a planned daily programme. It consists of time for study, rest, recreation and self development in desirable proportion which provides an opportunity for the development of student's body, mind and intellect. The daily programme is given in Appendix - II.
